RTC PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- ✓ Improve access to well-coordinated child protection services and psychosocial support activities for girls and boys impacted by the conflict, children at risk and survivors.
- ✓ Unaccompanied and separated children, and other children with protection concerns are assessed and receive holistic support through case management and referrals to specialized services
- ✓ Effective monitoring, prevention and response to grave violations of children's rights, with a focus on reintegration of children (girls and boys) associated with armed groups
- ✓ Enhance protection of people in need through livelihood, recovery, and social cohesion; promote a rights-based approach to durable solutions and strengthen justice systems

RTC PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS

- ✓ Trained Twenty Five (25) Community Base Child Protection Committee (CBCPC) on how to develop early warning sign mechanism.
- ✓ Trained 9 case workers on case management and development of care plan and referrals.
- ✓ Trained Six (6) CJTF and 12 CBCPC members on how to identify Child Associated with Arm Forces (CAAFAC) in Mubi and Michika
- ✓ Trained 9 Psychosocial Support Facilitators (PSS) on positive counseling sessions, and how to organize good recreational activities including peer group activities.
- ✓ Trained 120 caregivers/Foster parents on positive parental care in Mubi and Michika.
- ✓ The project Provided grants of 20,000 to 130 caregivers to help improve their resilience and take care of their children by establishing small business scheme.
- ✓ The project case managed over 200 children with protection concerns in both Mubi and Michika.
- ✓ The project reached over 2000 children with a Child Friendly Activities in Mubi and Michika.
- ✓ The project established Six (6) Child Help Desk in Communities of Mubi South and Michika.
